2. Prior to NEP 2020, pre school education was not standardised, but now, MoE, NCERT & CBSE has taken up the initiative towards standardization of Pre school as 3 years program for children of the age group 3 to 6 yrs
3. For standard I-XII, it envisages an age bracket of 6 to 18 yrs.
4. Taking into consideration, the age criteria followed in different states of India, a leeway of 6 months has been recommended at APSs & APPSs with a conditional Affidavit for those who are not fulfilling the said age criteria.
5. Kindly guide your comid schools accordingly please.

ADVISORY FOR ADMISSION OF CHILDREN IN APSs AND APPSs

1. As a result of NEP 2020 implementation, a large number of representations are being received from the environment regarding clarifications on age criteria for admission in Class - I and Nursery.
2. NEP-2020 does not directly set the minimum age criterion as 6 years for admission to Class - I, however, it considers covering child education from 3 to 18 years (Pre-School to Class - XII) in place of earlier 6 to 14 years (Class - I to VIII) as envisaged in RTE 2009. Neither RTE nor any of the NEPs strictly demarcates minimum age criterion for admission in Class-I. As a matter of fact, setting 6 years of age for admission to Class-I by some state Governments & education Deptt has probably been derived from the age brackets as mentioned in RTE & NEPs. Some states have long been following the criterion of 6 years of age for admission in class-I in Govt Schools.
3. HQ AWES vide letter No B/46001/APPs/AWES dt 30 Mar 2021, has already forwarded an advisory to all Commands suggesting to fix 3 yrs of the age at the time of admission in Nursery class, wef 2021-22.
4. Taking into consideration KVS Admission Notice-2022-23 and above mentioned AWES letter dt 30 Mar 2021, the age criteria for admission in APPSs and APSs are recommended as follows :-
 - (a) Attaining 3 years of age for admission to Nursery class as on 31 Mar of the academic session.
 - (b) Attaining 6 years of age for admission to Class - I as on 31 Mar of the academic session.

5. All states do not consider 31 March to be the common deadline date for admission to schools and it ranges from 31 March to 30th September of the academic session. Hence, it is advised not to deny admission to a child who does not attain the said age as on 31st March but attains the same by 30th Sep of the academic session. However, an affidavit to this effect be taken from the parents of such a child on the attached format.

6. The Schools are also expected to guide the concerned parents of individual child about the long term ill consequences of admitting a child below the set age criterion for admission to schools.
